THE KEEPERS confirm,—(1) A bond and obligation granted by George, Lord Spynie, to PATRICK MURRAY of Bourntoune, servitor to Johne Earl of Kinghorne, dated 26th November 1646, whereby for the sums of money therein specified, paid by the said Patrick to the said Lord Spynie, the said Lord Spynie bound himself, his heirs and successors, to infest the said Patrick, his assignees and bairns therein mentioned, in an annual-rent of 400 merks Scots, payable at Whit-
